Fishy win in competition for students at Wulguru

SOMETHING is fishy at Wulguru State School.

But it's nothing untoward — the school is sporting a massive new fish tank thanks to the Creek to Coral Program.

Year 3 students at the school won an art competition at Perc Tucker Regional Gallery focusing on water conservation.

The competition challenged school students to design artwork showcasing the region's catchment areas and waterways and how they can be affected by human activities.

"It's about water conservation and water protection and teaching young people how important water is," Wulguru State School

Year 3 teacher Leann Clausen said.

Students from 11 local schools and a community group created collages on water droplet shaped paper for the competition, which was run in conjunction with Townsville City Council.

"On each raindrop they had to have ideas for storing water," Ms Clausen said.

"Overall our class won the most votes."

First prize was a fish tank and a \$100 voucher to buy tropical fish.

The students participated in Creek to Coral Catchment tours of the local area, providing inspiration for their creations.
